Lesson Plan and Activities

Page to Stage Lesson Plan

In this lesson, students will read and analyze an excerpt from Act III, Scene 1 of William Shakespeare's *A Midsummer Night's Dream* using the included handouts.

Shakespeare Taboo

Students will gain a new appreciation for Shakespeare's contribution to the English language.

Paraphrasing

Students unlock Shakespeare's text by rewording of the meaning of the lines into their vernacular.

Write a Review

After seeing the production, have each student write a review of Orlando Shakes' production of *A Midsummer Night's Dream*.

What is the role of Love, Jealousy and Transformation in the story? What role does Magic play in these?
